



Faculty earned badges for completing this event and will bring new AI insights into your classrooms soon.

New Tools in Canvas

We've just added *PinPoint* to Canvas! This tool helps professors identify students who may need extra support, so they can step in early to keep you on track. Plus, *TurnItIn* is still here to help detect plagiarism, and we're exploring new tools to address AI-generated content fairly.



More Ways to Engage

The DTAL team is expanding digital literacy workshops for special community groups, including the unhoused and incarcerated, ensuring everyone has access to essential digital skills.

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CELEBRATING OUR ANCHOR COMMUNITIES

BUILDING DIGITAL SKILLS WITH OUR ANCHOR COMMUNITIES: A SIMMONS COLLEGE OF KENTUCKY INITIATIVE

Simmons College of Kentucky is committed to making digital learning accessible to everyone in our community. Through the Anchor Communities Initiative, we're working with local partners to bring tech skills and resources to underserved neighborhoods in Louisville. With major support from the Connecting Minorities and Communities (CMC) grant, our Digital Teaching and Learning (DTAL) Center has launched digital literacy projects with organizations like and the Louisville Central Community Center (LCCC).



Simmons Senior Tech Hub at ElderServe: Digital Literacy Workshops

This fall, the DTAL Center teamed up with ElderServe, an adult day care service in Louisville's Russell neighborhood, to host a series of digital literacy workshops specifically for senior citizens. Running from August to November 2024, these workshops provided seniors ages 60 and up the tech skills to safely and confidently use the internet, email, and other digital tools.

We celebrated the first cohort with a special ceremony for our ElderServe graduates on **November 15, from 11 am-1 pm**.

In Spring 2025, we're launching a new series of workshops for a second group of ElderServe participants. This group will follow a similar schedule and curriculum, covering everything from computer basics to using mobile technology and Google.



SIMMONS DUAL CREDIT PROGRAM:

Preparing Students for Success

Fall 2024 Dual Credit Review

We're thrilled to see that over 77% of students in Simmons College's dual credit program feel prepared for their future careers and college majors! This fall, we kicked off our dual credit courses for high school students across Kentucky, working toward the state's 2030 goal of having 50% of high schoolers complete at least one dual credit course with a grade of C or better. This program is part of Simmons College's commitment to providing accessible education, especially for underserved students.

Current Enrollment and Courses

This semester, 23 high school students from schools like Grace James Academy, W.E.B. DuBois Academy, J. Graham Brown School, and even one homeschool student joined us for dual credit classes. Courses offered include:

- CIS Computer Information Systems (8 weeks)
- BFI Black Film Institute (8 weeks)

What Students and Parents Are Saying

We gathered feedback from students and parents to make sure we're delivering the best experience:

- **Course Length**: Many students would prefer 16-week courses instead of the current 8-week format.
- **Support and Engagement**: Students loved the immediate support and in-person meetings with professors. They highlighted how responsive and helpful everyone has been.
- **Course Variety**: Partner schools have asked for more options, like a writing-focused course to support students' skills.

Based on this input, we're considering adding courses like Public Speaking, a lab component for Black Film Institute, Foundations of Success, and Foundations of Business.

Looking Ahead

We're already planning for future opportunities! For Fall 2025, we're exploring dual credit enrollment in our Aviation program with W.E.B. DuBois Academy and meeting with additional high schools like Shawnee, Valley, and Seneca to expand pathways to student success.




This infographic shows QM certified faculty and instructional staff and QM certified courses.


SIMMONS LIBRARY


Here's some exciting news about how our library is making getting the books you need easier (and cheaper!). So far this fall, our library's book checkouts are up! In the first three months of 2024, students checked out 91 print books, compared to 70 last year, and downloaded 290 eBooks. That's 381 books in total—an awesome number for a college our size!


And there's more: our library is now part of a pilot program with JSTOR, giving us free access to a growing collection of eBooks for at least the next three years! This aligns with our commitment to keeping your book costs low (or even zero). Along with Cengage Unlimited and other eBook subscriptions, we're also promoting OER (Open Educational Resources) to ensure you have affordable access to textbooks.

In fact, zero out-of-pocket (OOP) options are on the rise here. This fall, 88.46% of classes used zero-OOP primary texts, and over half of those used Cengage Unlimited books. Not only does this save money, but it also means you have access to the material from Day One, so professors can dive right into teaching!

The one area where zero-OOP texts are still a challenge is Religious Studies, due to the unique focus on African American history, Black Church history, and social justice topics, which aren't widely available in typical eBook or OER options. We're working with Tennessee State University on an OER initiative for HBCUs to help solve this. This is a great example of the strength of HBCU partnerships to create resources that really meet our needs.







Library traffic has stabilized following significant growth over the past two semesters (15.71 per day in Fall 2024; 17.23 in Spring 2024; 16.65 in Fall 2023; 11.18 in Spring 2023), while traffic to the library computer lab has increased mightily since the Writing Center took over operations of this space (3.55 per day in Fall 2024, up from 1.91 per day in Fall 2023). Library traffic is even steadier when judging by median attendance rather than average, accounting for large events driving up averages (15 for Fall 2024; 15.5 for Spring 2024; 14.5 for Fall 2023; 8 for Spring 2023). The library will continue to balance the desire to increase in-person traffic with providing convenient services that keep our commuter students from ever needing to visit the library in person.

The library continues its upward trajectory and seeks new ways to grow. A college's library is foundational to its success, and the Simmons Library is a solid rock on this foundation.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS: Simmons Online Courses

What is Distance Learning? Who can take these classes?

Distance Learning offers flexible, fully-accredited online courses that are equivalent to oncampus classes. If you're eligible for regular classes, you can also enroll in Distance Learning. Check the Simmons Class Schedule for registration details.

How do these courses work? How will I interact with my instructor?

In online classes, you'll connect with instructors and classmates through Canvas. Your instructor posts lectures, assignments, and announcements, and you can respond with questions or comments.

Will I need to come to campus?

Nope! These classes are entirely online. However, you're always welcome to stop by campus for access to additional student services.

How are exams given?

Exams vary by course. Your instructor will provide the details in your syllabus.

What tech do I need to get started?

Here's what you need:

- Regular internet access
- A computer with an updated web browser like Chrome
- Simmons email account
- Word processing software (e.g., Microsoft Word)

If you're missing any tech, Chromebooks are available for checkout from the campus library, and computer labs are open for student use.

Can I take an online course if I don't have a personal computer?

Yes! Just make sure you'll have reliable access to a computer with internet, either at home or on campus.

What computer skills should I have?

Basic computer skills are a must! You'll need to know how to use word processing software, send and receive emails, and navigate the web. These skills help you focus on learning instead of troubleshooting.

How can I tell if online learning is right for me?

Success in online classes requires self-motivation and strong time management. If you're a good reader and writer and can stay on top of assignments without in-person meetings, Distance Learning could be a great fit.

Do I have to be online at specific times?

Some courses may have scheduled times for quizzes or discussions. Contact your instructor to find out.

What should I do if I need help?

If you run into any issues, reach out to your instructor first! They're available via email or phone and may also hold virtual office hours. You can also get academic support through Simmons' Falcons Academic Center of Excellence. Call **502-776-1443 ext-5902** for info about free tutoring.

What if I can't access my course online?

Course Textbooks and Cengage

Some classes use Cengage Unlimited for e-books and activities. Look for the Cengage link in Canvas to access materials, and make sure to complete only the activities assigned in your Canvas module.

Can online courses transfer to other schools?

It's best to confirm with the school you're transferring to. Simmons transcripts don't show if a course was online or on-campus.

What if I need to withdraw from my course?

If you need to drop a class, make sure to do so before the deadline to avoid any issues with your grade. You can find withdrawal deadlines in the Simmons Class Schedule.

Staying on Track with Your Catalog Requirements

You're allowed to follow the Catalog requirements for your first year as long as you stay continuously enrolled. If you take a break, you'll follow the requirements from the Catalog in effect when you return.
